SBA Backs Congressional, Stakeholder Calls to Withdraw Flawed Waters Proposal

We applaud the Small Business Administration for sending <u>comments</u> urging EPA and the Army Corps of Engineers to withdraw a proposed Waters of the U.S. (WOTUS) rule. SBA said that more state and industry input is needed and EPA should do a required small business impacts review before moving forward. The comments emphasized that EPA and the Army Corps improperly determined the WOTUS proposal would not directly affect small businesses and skipped the impacts review. SBA's comments support co-op concerns that the proposal would create more red tape and delays for power line siting and maintenance.

EPA and the Army Corps still show no signs of backing down from their regulatory overreach to expand the Clean Water Act to include ditches, flood plains, wetland and seasonal streams.

EPA's Science Advisory Board issued a statement supporting the underlying science of the WOTUS proposal and even recommended the proposed rule could also include groundwater and isolated waters with little or no connection to navigable waters.

Agriculture Leaders Urge USDA Action on EPA's GHG Proposal

We thank the Senate and House Agriculture committee leaders for urging USDA to continue raising concerns with EPA about how its existing power plant greenhouse gas rule could impact the Rural Utilities Service Electric Loan Program and its borrowers. The letter signed by the committees' chairs and ranking members (attached) noted that EPA estimates the plan would force 17 co-op coal-fired power plants to shut down to comply with the rule. The letter asks Agriculture Secretary Vilsack to ensure that RUS electric borrowers are not adversely impacted and have tools to manage additional capital investment or early plant retirements.

Co-ops Mentioned Among Takeover Prospects in Citigroup Report

I want to alert you to a <u>Citigroup</u> report listing electric co-ops and municipal utilities as attractive

acquisitions for investor-owned utilities. We have no specific information about any new co-op takeover plans or that acquisition attempts are increasing. And, the report appears to be more a business development effort than an indication of any particular threat. When addressing takeover issues, NRECA is ready to provide information like the <u>Electric Cooperative Takeover Considerations</u>.
