Many NRECA members recently received a letter alleging their website violates the Americans with Disabilities Act (“ADA”) and similar acts. To assist its members and their attorneys in analyzing and addressing the letter, NRECA retained outside legal counsel experienced in this area. With outside counsel’s assistance, NRECA prepared and distributed a memorandum addressing legal issues raised in the letter.
