Summary

- At 6PM, the National Hurricane Center has begun issuing advisories on Tropical Storm Andrea. Andrea is located at 22.3 N and 86.5W which is 310 miles to the southwest of Tampa, Florida. Andrea is moving at 3mph to the North with maximum sustained winds at 40mph, gusting to 50mph.
- Tropical Storm Andrea is forecast to strengthen slightly over the next 24 hours, but will remain at tropical storm status until landfall later on Thursday night. The Storm is forecast to exit the state on Friday.
- Tropical Storm Warnings have been issued from Boca Grande to the Ochlocknee River along the Gulf Coast and Tropical Storm Watches are issued from Flagler Beach to Surf City North Carolina.
- Reconnaissance aircraft has finished investigating the storm this evening and another flight is scheduled tomorrow at 2AM.

Florida Outlook

- Flood watches are in effect for a majority of the Peninsula until Thursday evening and Friday morning as more rain is expected to fall over the next 48 hours. Rain totals for the next 72 hours are expected to reach 6-7 inches across South Florida and along the West Central Gulf Coast. Meanwhile, 4-6 inches are anticipated for the rest of the Florida Peninsula, and 2-4 inches of rain are expected for the Big Bend. Isolated areas may receive and addition 1-3 inches of rainfall.
- Currently, the Storm Prediction Center has placed the west central portion of the Peninsula under a "slight risk" for severe weather Thursday morning through Friday morning. As Andrea makes landfall tornadoes and waterspouts are possible anywhere along the Peninsula in this slight risk area.
- Coastal Flood Advisories have been issued from Levy to Lee County from 8pm Wednesday thru 8pm Friday. Minor coastal flooding may occur in these counties as high tides may run 1-3 feet above normal during this time frame.
